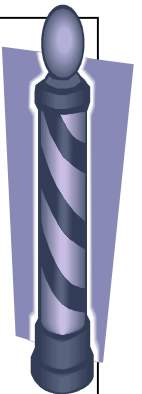

## Ripple Effect of our Emotions

As I was pondering on this month's article, I ask God what He would like me to share from my heart. I kept coming to this thought of the Ripple Effect of our Emotions. I hesitated to write yet another article on the tragic accident of May 29<sup>th</sup>, not wanting to encumber our emotional senses. Yet, as much as I probed internally, these thoughts kept coming. So please appreciate the heart by which I share these thoughts.

As you drop a pebble into a pond you can readily see the ripple effect of the pebble as the watery waves reverberate from the point of impact. So goes our emotions for the May 29<sup>th</sup> tragedy that beset our community.

The ripple effect is an education-related term associated with the studies of [Jacob Kounin](#). It involves the effects that a reprimand in a group has on members of the group who are not the intended targets of the reprimand. The same affect is seen when we suffer such a significant tragedy. The ripple effect starts from the actual incident to the five families horrendously touched by the tragedy, to literally hundreds of friends.

The ripple effect of our emotions ranges from bewilderment, to horror, to sadness, to anger and beyond. Every emotion that you have and are experiencing is appropriate and normal by the very fact that you are experiencing that particular emotion.

As our emotions are a barometer of the heart, so goes our hearts during this time. The accident continues to have reverberating ripple effects on us. As we continue to read in the Press, to viewing the Buell Road memorials, to commemorative car stickers, to the dreadful ongoing legal troubles, the heart is torn.

As the ripples of the waves come and go so does our emotions come and go. There are be times when we feel numb, other times we feel nauseous, other times we feel anger and rage, yet at other times we may feel guilty for having feelings of peacefulness or happiness. Please know these ever stirring emotions do not stop and they will continue for weeks and months to come. This is very normal and it is best to allow yourself to feel the ebb and flow of the emotions just as the rippled waves.

The best thing to do to take care of your emotional self is make sure you have a healthy "sounding board" in which to process your emotions. You need an emotionally healthy person that knows and loves you unconditionally. A person that can absorb some of your pain and reflect back in a healthy way to you that allows you to process and proceed on just as our kids would want us to do.

### MEMO DELIVERY COORDINATOR NEEDED!!

If you'd like a simple way to get involved in the Pleasant Run Farms community this may be your answer! The Memo staff has an opening for the Delivery Coordinator. This monthly job only requires about 2 hours of your time each month. Here is a general description of what this (adult) person does:

- picks up the Memo from the printer (located just north of route 4) the Thursday before the weekend the Memo is delivered (the Memo is always delivered the first weekend that both Saturday and Sunday fall within the month).
- counts the Memos out for each of the 14 delivery kids (the printer puts marking papers between every 50 Memos which makes counting easy).
- takes a check given to you monthly to the bank and cashes it, and divides it up to give to the delivery kids with their Memos.
- drop the Memos off to the 14 delivery kids' homes on Friday of the weekend that it is delivered.
- fills any openings that may occur when kids "retire" from their routes.
