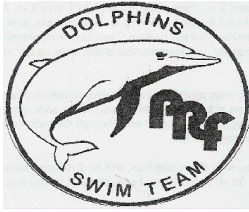

 Minutes of the General Meeting
 April 27, 2006

A general meeting of the Pleasant Run Farms Civic Association was held on April 27, 2006 at Welch Elementary School. The Vice President, Chip Bergquist called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

The Vice President dispensed with the reading of the minutes. The minutes were approved as submitted in the memo. The winners of the 2006 PRFCA Senior Scholarships were announced. The winners were Danielle Henry and Mackenzie Agin.

The Vice President introduced the two guest speakers, Chris Gilbert Development Services Director for Springfield Township and Gwen McFarland Trustee for Springfield Township. Chris Gilbert spoke about Township Zoning and the Property Maintenance Code both of which are going very well. The Winton Road project should begin in February 2007. This project will widen a portion of Winton road and add a streetscape plan that will add sidewalks, lighting, landscaping etc. Mr. Gilbert also reported that all of the Capitol improvement projects have been completed. Trustee Gwen McFarland spoke about the repaving of several of our streets in Pleasant Run farms. The streets that are on the schedule to be repaved are, Belgreen Ln., Blackhawk Circle, Briarfield Ct., Broadhurst Ave., and Elkwood Dr. from Kemper to Deerhorn Dr. The MSD project on Hazelgrove Dr. from the pump station to Mill Rd. is set to begin in the next couple of weeks. The work being done should take about a month to complete.

President - No Report

Vice President - Chip Bergquist reported that the Great American Clean Up went very well this year. There were 24 volunteers and about 26 bags of garbage were collected.

Treasurer - Chris Rowland reported that the balance in the checking account is \$27.54 and the balance in the savings account is \$8,466.08. There is also \$5,000.00 in a CD.

Secretary - Cheryl Purvis reported that the next meeting of the PRFCA will be May 18 at 8:00 p.m. hosted by Kim Pittman.

Athletics - Michelle Sager reported that spring ball season has started. The first T-ball games were rained out and will be made up at another time. Baseball games were played and the Softball teams were in a tournament. Swim Team Dry Land starts May 30; in water will start June 8. The first swim meet is the week of June 12. The Swim Team will be grilling out at the PRF Garage Sale at Clifford George Fields. There is an Officials class for anyone that would like to be a swim meet official at the Countryside Y in Lebanon on May 6. Certification is good for 3 years. The price for the class is \$35.00 if you have a book already and \$40.00 without a book. SAY and Lollipop sign up will be Tuesday, May 2 at Pleasant Run Elementary from 6:00-8:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 9 at Welch Elementary from 6:00-8:00 p.m. and Saturday, May 13 at John Wesley Church from 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Pleasant Run Farms has been invited to walk in Mt. Healthy's Memorial Day Parade. Contact Becky Hoover at 742-3442 for more information.

Communications - Krista Hepp no report
