
PRF Sports report:

The fall sports season has begun at PRF. This year we have 36 boys and girls playing Lollipop soccer. This is really significant as it shows good growth over last year. There were only 16 players in last year's Lollipop program. We intend to use this fall soccer program to build our younger teams in PRF spring sports and future PRF soccer programs.

These 4 – 6 years old take the field on Friday nights. Divided into four teams they are learning the fundamentals of the game. Rich Wisecarver, a longtime PRF resident and coach in our PRF Athletic Association, heads up our soccer program this year. He is assisted by several parents who stepped forward to help coach the teams. Already Rich has had several parents compliment him about the soccer program and happy that their kids can play at a field so close and parking so readily available.

On the baseball front, PRFAA is working with Mike Gould and Springfield township about grading the two infields at Clifford George. Due to the heavy rains this year the township has had to meet other priorities. Mike still intends to do this but it will be later this fall.

With the demolition of Welch and Pleasant Run Elementary schools, the Athletic Association lost 6 practices fields – 3 at Welch and 3 more at Pleasant Run. Northwest school district had talked about two fields being built at Pleasant Run elementary by next spring. The PRF baseball commissioner and coaches are looking into additional solutions.

President's Update



The proposed Welch Property developer, TJ Ackerman was at our September PRF Civic Association General Meeting to discuss his firm's plan for the development of the 11 acre Welch School property. He indicated that they plan to include 30 homes and a detention pond on the property. There will be one entrance to the street off of Deerhorn. Houses will probably be in the \$180,000 to \$240,000 range with builders yet to be selected. The majority of PRF residents attending the General Meeting were in favor of developing homes on the property. Next, the NWLSD Superintendent, Todd Bowling will present the sale proposal to the School Board for approval. The PRFCA will continue to monitor the planned development.

The street resurfacing planned for Cedar Creek, Centerbrook and Canfield should begin shortly. We anticipate completion by November. We are hoping that next year we will have Kemper Rd, east of Hamilton and Brookway resurfaced. Brookway is considered a Gateway to the Farms and is in need of repair. This would be a joint project with Hamilton County and Springfield Township. The Civic Association will be sending a letter to the Ohio Public Works outlining the poor condition of Kemper Rd. and its potential for accidents. If you have any thoughts on the need for Kemper's repair email them to me at skipwicklund@gmail.com. To date, we have not had any comments from residents of the Farms. All comments submitted to the State will help in seeking funds for the repairs.



Garden and Landscape Fall Maintenance

The month of October generally brings on the cooler, dryer climate which allows mums to flourish. These plants produce a variety of color blooms continuing through early to mid autumn. If moderately watered and sheltered, they can survive the first week of frost. It usually takes a couple of hard nightly frosts to burn the blooms. However, mums are hardy plants which survive the winter months if properly cut back and securely rooted. I prefer the larger rainbow mum planter displays consisting of two or three color varieties. They seem to bring life back to the flower beds as summer extreme weather has taken its toll.

As cool weather approaches and frost is in the forecast, I begin the process of landscape clean-up. Clearing flower beds and pruning perennials in the fall is a matter of personal preference. I prefer the winter landscape view of leveled beds and pruned bushes and trees. In addition, this allows a fresh start for Spring flower bed preparation and mulching.

Now that watering and plant maintenance has reduced to fifty percent, this gives me a chance to discard old non-productive baskets and annuals. The more I can clear within a weekly walkthrough, the less work involved when the 'killer frost' arrives.

Subsequently, everything seems to go at once. I take one bed at a time; emptying baskets, pulling annuals, and cutting down (to ground level) Grasses, Hostas, Tigerlilies, Daylilies, and Lily of the Valley. Care must be taken when 'pulling' or 'cutting' the bed arrangements. Some plants like Daylilies, Easter Lilies, and Asiatic Lilies, originate from bulbs. Pulling the bulb vs. cutting the plant to ground level requires re-planting the bulb. These plants/bulbs tend to double and triple every season. Over time the plants will cluster and show more foliage and less blooms. It is advisable to extract and divide the bulbs for re-planting in the Spring.

Once the beds are completely cleared, I like to loosen or overturn the old mulch to allow aeration and moisture to penetrate the bed. A lightly applied dry fertilizer mixed within the mulch seems to encourage Spring growth. New triple shredded mulch is applied every Spring, however it is advisable to clear old mulch after several seasons of layering. Some gardeners clear the old mulch every Spring before applying the new layer. This will prevent mold build-up, harmful to plant health. I generally trim one last sharp edge around the beds in mid-November, when the lawn finally begins the dormant stage. A final note on cleared flower beds. Our Bradford Pear and Flowering Crab trees drop leaves until mid-December. Raking leaves from clean, leveled beds is much easier than working around dead plants and rooted debris.

Our Fall lawn care preference includes: September aeration and over-

seeding, October fertilizing (fast release nitrogen and iron mix), November winterizing (slow release nitrogen). Over the years, this lawn care program has been successful for jump starting early Spring growth, thickness, and color. In addition, the Fall applications seem to control the Spring emergence of grey snow mold and red thread fungus.

Our Fall clean-up process finishes approximately mid-December. The renewed Spring preparation begins in late March (including lawn mowing). With some wishful thinking, very little if any snow removal in-between.
