PRF 4th of July Parade

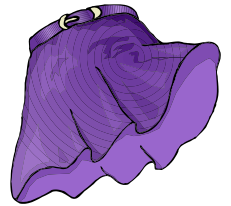

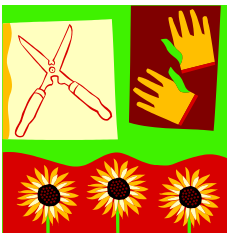
Calling all men 18 and up from Pleasant Run Farms!

A meeting of the Pleasant Run Farms Civic Association was held Thursday, May 16th, 2013 at 7:00pm at the swim club. The following are the minutes from that meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:42pm.

President: Kevin Puccini reported he has received concerns related to parking issues during ball games at Clifford George Field such as parking along Mill Road. Discussion of entrance signs being placed at various points for the PRF community and how we can make this happen.

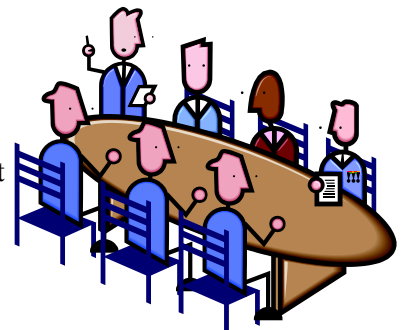
Community Activities: Linda Boylson reported about 10 people volunteered for the Great American Cleanup in our community, down from previous years. 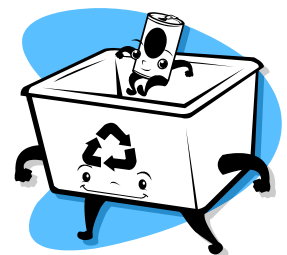

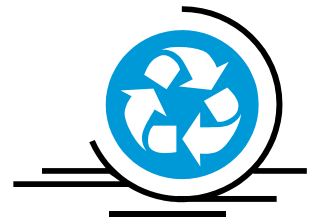
