PRFCA Scholarship Winner

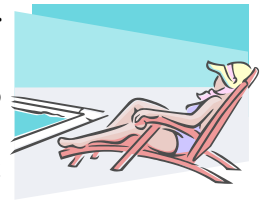

PRFCA GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

A General Meeting of the Pleasant Run Farms Civic Association was held Thursday, April 25th, 2013 at 7:30 pm in the Welch Elementary library. The following are the minutes from that meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm.

President: Kevin Puccini reported concerns have been brought to the Springfield Township police department's attention recently such as parking issues and a couple reports of vandalism. Residents are encouraged to stay watchful of suspicious activity in the Farms. Opening day at Clifford George Field this year was well attended and successful.

Vice President: POSITION OPEN AT THIS TIME.

Treasurer: Ed McNett reported April's beginning checking account balance was \$4566.07. After income from memberships and memo ads, and expenses for April's hard-copy memo printing, insurances and the PRFCA scholarship payment, the ending balance for April is \$3601.07. Treasurer's report was accepted by vote from the Board.

Secretary: Christina Norris presented the 2013 PRFCA Scholarship Award to Elizabeth Jergens. Please see article in this month's memo for details about our scholarship winner. Two community residents, who are PRFCA members, volunteered to assist with the application judging this year, both of whom have the Board and the Scholarship Chairperson's thanks for the time and effort.

Athletic Director: Erin Knox—not present—submitted written report prior to meeting. The PRF Athletic Association has 17 teams currently with 210 players—the teams include 9 baseball, 4 t-ball and 4 girl's softball. There has been a growth among the younger teams, as 9 of the teams are children ages 8 and under. There are 8 new coaches this year. All teams participated in Opening Day activities at Clifford George Field on April 6th. There were about 40 adults who helped with opening day activities—sprucing up the area beforehand, trimming brush from the field area, adding dirt to sections of the field, and manning concessions. The pitching cage is now open and actively used. Ballgames will be played until the end of June.

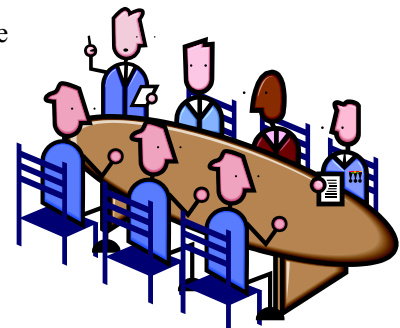
Communications: Venita Vivians—not present—submitted written report prior to meeting. The April memo was a hard copy memo, and was delivered the first weekend of April as scheduled. The May memo will be an electronic distribution delivered the weekend of May 4th. All ads and articles needed for the May memo are due by tomorrow, April 26th. The Board discussed articles needed for the memo, as suggested by Venita in her report.

Membership Report: Judy Smith—Judy is new to the role and reports she is still getting acclimated. She has been getting requests for the discount cards for members but needs to obtain them from the previous membership director. President will contact the previous membership director to obtain the cards for distribution.

Community Activities: Linda Boylson reported the Great American Cleanup will be held on Saturday, May 11th. Participants are encouraged to sign up online at the Springfield Township website prior to the event date. The annual PRF Garage Sale will be held on May 18th and traditionally it has been held from 8 am—1 pm. There will be no maps and no cost this year. Simply set your items out that day and have fun. The 4th of July parade will once again take place this year. Lawnmowers (blades removed) and motorcycles are encouraged. Linda is looking into getting horses for the parade. The annual skirt game will follow, taking place at Clifford George Field.

Pool: Tonya Klei reported the new “payment plan” system for pool memberships is up and running online at the PRF website, and has been utilized by some residents. Membership prices have stayed the same for this year. The fence separating the baby pools from the main pool is being replaced this year through a donation. The pool is in good shape and we have hired lifeguards. The pool will open May 25th and will operate 12 pm—8 pm daily. Residents are reminded that the pool does offer private parties and after-hours parties from 8 pm—12 am. Residents are encouraged to contact Tonya with any questions.

Announcements: None

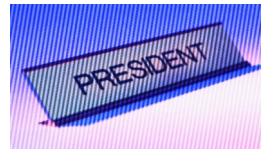
Being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:29 pm.

Spring has sprung in Pleasant Run Farms—or at least I think it has!!! The grass needs mowing, baseball and softball are being played, and more and more people can be seen outdoors. But the weather just doesn't want to let go of winter-cool temperatures and blustery winds. In any case there are a lot of activities starting up in the farms and we would like you to be aware of them, participate if you desire and get involved in your community.



As mentioned before there is Baseball and Softball going on, Great American clean up, the community Garage sale and then the pool will be opening! If you have more interest in serving your community, the position of Vice President of the Civic Association is available. Please contact any board member to find out more about this position.

As you may or may not know the Civic Association—through your memberships and participation—brings the community together through activities and events such as Baseball Opening Day, Great American Clean-ups, the Pool, Soccer and many others. We also ensure the greenbelt isn't used for development by maintaining the insurance and property tax on it. However, we as a board cannot accomplish any of these things without your help and participation.

With the warmer weather we also get Spring Cleaning. An opportunity to get rid of old and unwanted items—through the community garage sale or through the trash. Just so everyone is aware, if you set a large or unusual item at the curb to be picked up, you need to notify Rumpke 24 hours before your regularly scheduled pick up so they can plan on picking it up at 1-800-582-3107. They also said that it may sit there up to a week before it is picked up, so be patient. If it is not picked up in a week, please contact them again.

We have heard about a few vehicles being broken into around the farms recently. This is not a normal occurrence in our neighborhood and it is very disconcerting. It was brought up at the board meeting and through a few emails that have circulated through the farms. There was some discussion of a neighborhood watch being formed. We could really use someone to coordinate the efforts and spearhead a watch—would you be interested or know someone who would be? Even if there isn't a formal neighborhood watch we can all be vigilant about our neighborhood and report any suspicious or unusual activity to the Springfield police—the non-emergency number is 513-729-1300. I don't think the neighborhood is going downhill. I just think there is a "bad element" that has found some easy "pickings" in this neighborhood. We need to step up our efforts as a community to put a stop to it.

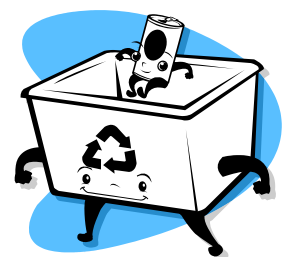

RECYCLE DUMPSTER—CLIFFORD GEORGE FIELDS

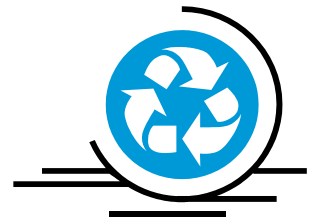

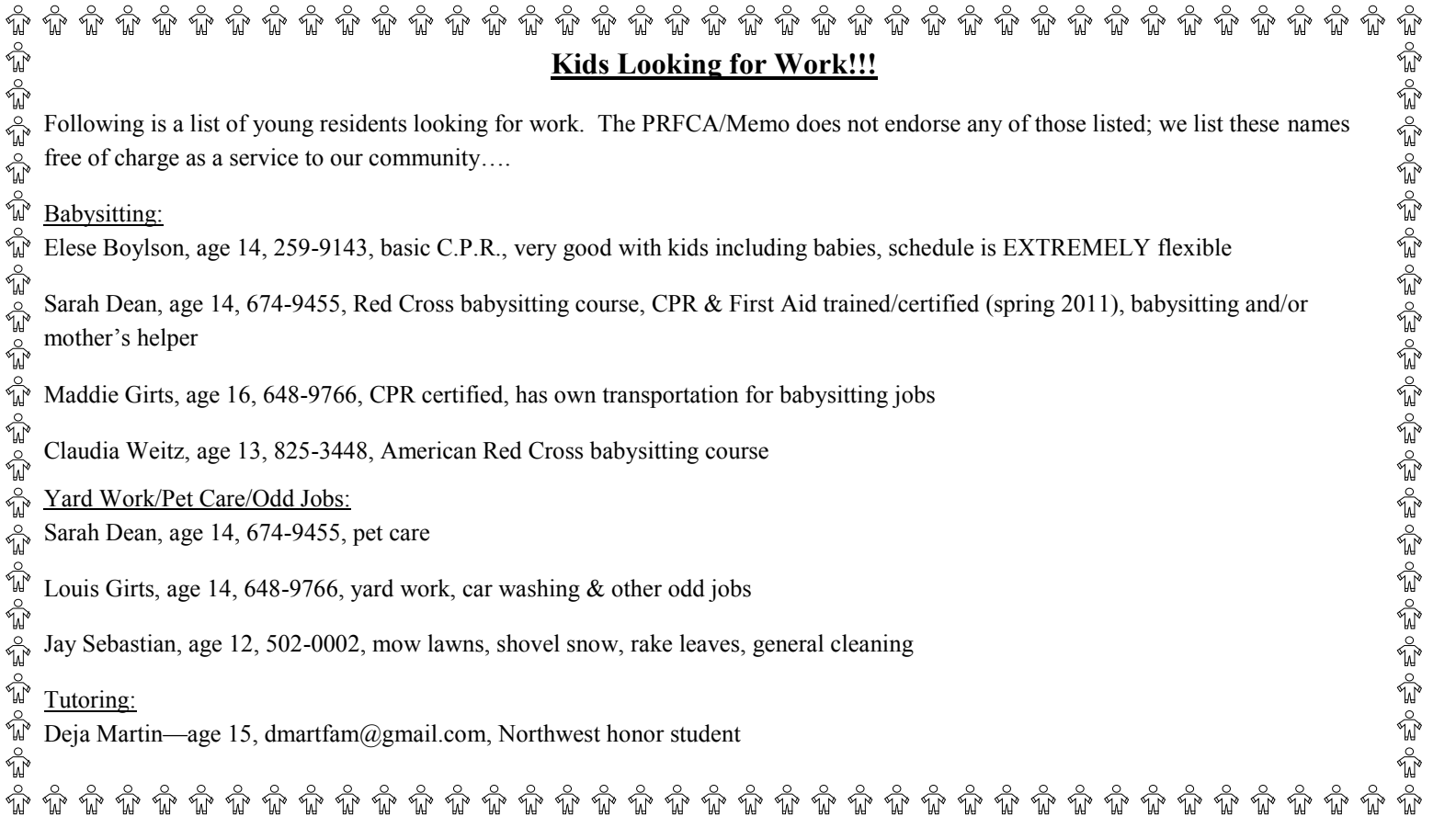

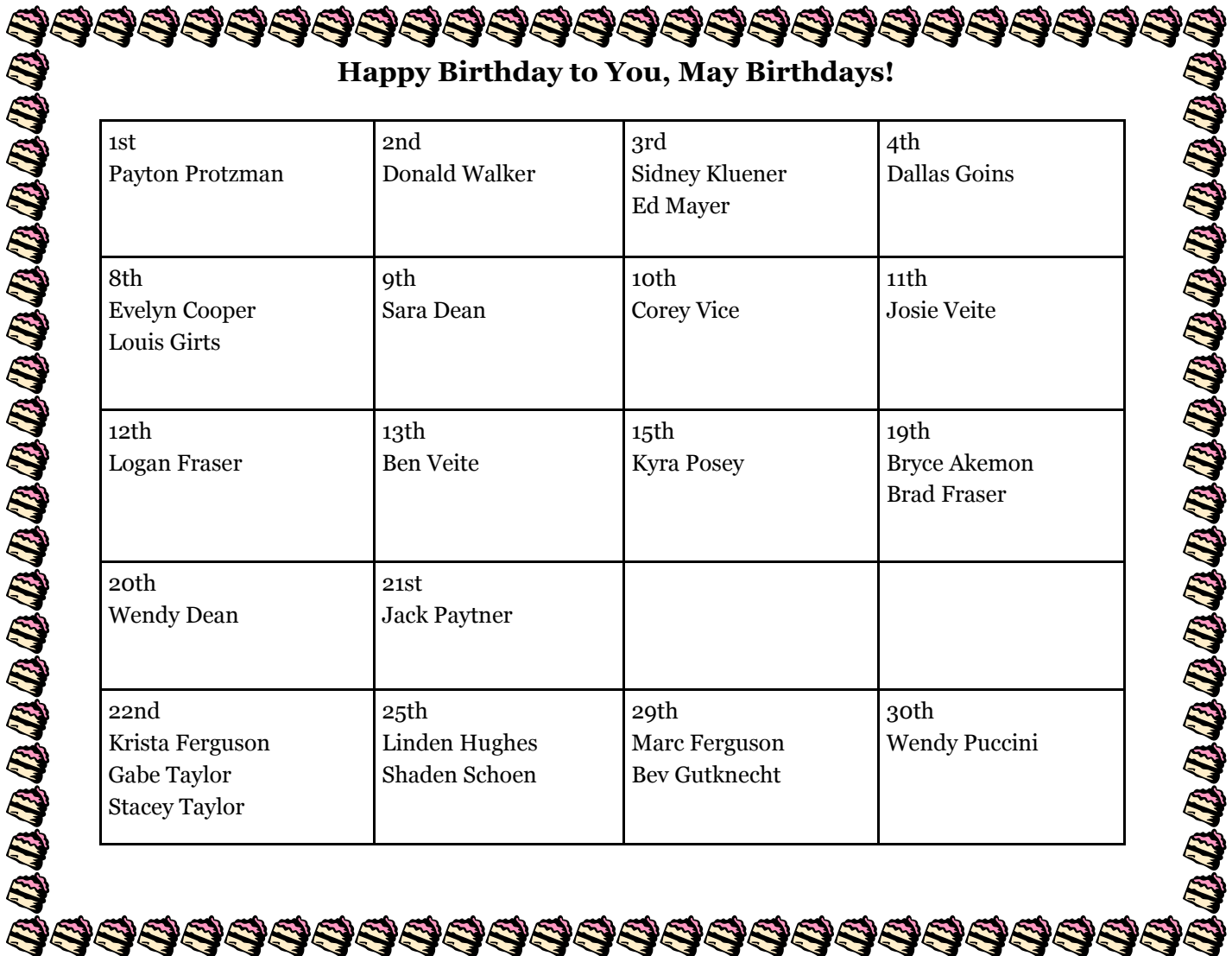
