PRFCA MEETING MINUTES

Pleasant Run Farms Civic Association
Association Meeting
August 21, 2014

A meeting of the Pleasant Run Farms Civic Association was held Thursday, August 21, 2014 at 7:00pm at the swim club. The following are the minutes from the meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:13pm.

President: Kevin Puccini held discussion with board regarding how to proceed on trees potentially infected by the Emerald Ash Borer in and around the greenbelt. We are still consulting outside professionals regarding what the Board's responsibility in these matters should and would be. A resident recently had an issue with potentially infected trees near her home, and the President is still following up on this and is in contact with the homeowner.

Vice President: Anna Fields reported she attended the most recent Springfield Township trustees meeting; pertinent items from the meeting included a reminder about the township leash law regarding unleashed dogs, and a reminder to residents to call police for assistance with wandering or loose dogs. Also discussed was the Chasers bar at the corner of Hamilton and Kemper Rd, the frequent police runs to this establishment and potential response.

Treasurer: Ed McNett – not present. No report submitted.

Secretary: Christina Norris has contacted Northwest Local School District regarding securing the Welch Elementary library for General Meetings this upcoming school year. Paperwork has been submitted. Next month's meeting will be a General Meeting in the school library, on September 25th. Residents are welcome and are encouraged to attend and participate.

Athletic Director: John Buschman in attendance tonight to give report. Soccer season is upon us and there are 12 teams overall. There are 140 players, which is a 15% increase from last fall. Games begin this weekend. On September 13th the local Kiwanis group will be working with the township to repaint the concession stand at Clifford George Field, as a service project.

Communications: Venita Vivians – not present. September's memo will be a hard copy memo, to be distributed to the entire PRF community the weekend of September 6th. All ads and articles are needed by August 29th.

Membership Report: Linda Boylson reported that any member who has not received their 2014 discount and membership card at this point should please contact her. She is aware there are still members who have not received their card. There was a transition this year in the membership position, which delayed the process. Linda plans to send a bulk email informing those who still wish to receive their card on how to obtain it. She is working on creating a more streamlined process for next year.

Community Activities: Misty Jackson – not present. No report submitted.

Pool: Susan Scheib from the pool committee presented this evening. Ed Mayer will be resigning as treasurer of the pool at the end of this season; a replacement is needed. The pool will close for the season on September 1st. There is a significant leak in the baby pool area which will need fixed in the off season. They are also still looking into getting concrete work done to the pool deck during the off-season and are currently soliciting bids. Anyone with experience in concrete work is welcome to contact Erin Knox, Pool Director, to discuss. A new swim team coach is also needed for next year.

Old Business: None

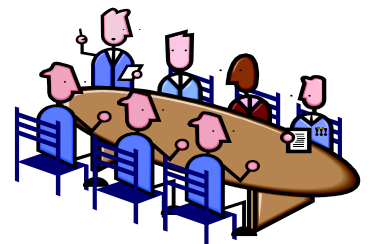
New Business: None.

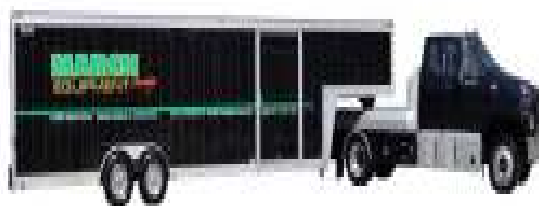

Kiwanis invites families of Pleasant Run Farms to enjoy a picnic of hot dogs, chips and drinks at Clifford George Park, Saturday, September 13th. The picnic will also serve as an opportunity for the Springfield Township Police to talk to residents about recent vandalism in and around the park. The picnic will begin at noon and residents are encouraged to attend.



Kiwanis, representing the communities of Springfield Township, Greenhills and Forest Park understands its role in the community, “We are here to help in any way we can,” explains Kiwanis member Ann Akeson. “Springfield Township asked for volunteers to help remove graffiti from the concession stand. We will be painting the stand with a graffiti-resistant paint before the picnic on September 13th.” Residents will be able to see the work Kiwanis completed and enjoy a free lunch.

Clifford George Park is home to children’s athletic events and family gatherings. It’s also a main community gateway. Over the past month, repeated acts of vandalism at the park are cause for concern. Springfield Township Police will take the opportunity to meet with residents at the picnic to share information on crime trends and what they can do to become part of the solution. The Fire Department will also be on hand to answer questions and will have a truck for children to explore.
